## Dr. Ines Erdmann (Hilden)

Dr. Erdmann studied Biology and Integrative Neuroscience at the University of Hamburg and the OVGU Magdeburg. During her PhD at the LIN and the OVGU Magdeburg, she was awarded with the Hugo-Junkers-Preis for her project: "*In vivo* cell-selective protein labeling using click chemistry". Since February 2017 she has been working as account manager at QIAGEN.



### Dr. Karin Bodewits (Munich)

Dr. Karin Bodewits is speaker, author, seminar leader and founder of the career platform NaturalScience.Careers. She studied Biology at the University of Groningen and received her PhD in Biochemistry at the University of Edinburgh. Since then she is working and writing around the topic "Women, career & science". She published a career guide for female natural scientists (Wiley, 2016) and her first novel 'You must be very intelligent - the PhD Delusion' (Springer, 2017).



## Dr. Marija Petrinovic (London)

Dr. Marija Petrinovic obtained her PhD in Neuroscience at the ETH Zurich and continued her career at the pharmaceutical company F. Hoffmann-La Roche supervising research concerning how malfunctions of neural circuits serve as hallmarks of neurodevelopmental disorders. In 2016, Marija joined King's College London to become a Lecturer (Assistant Professor) at the Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and Neuroscience.



# Dr. Grit Landgraf (Frankfurt a. M.)

Dr. Grit Landgraf studied Biochemistry and received her PhD in Biochemistry at the MPI in Halle (Saale). After a post-doctoral fellowship she joined the pharmaceutical industry where she held different positions in early and late stage clinical development of pharmaceuticals (Serumwerk Bernburg AG, NOXXON Pharma, Sandoz, Pfizer). Currently, she is working as a Medical Science Liaison at Otsuka Pharma GmbH.



#### Prof. Dr. Kristine Krug (Oxford)

Prof. Dr. Kristine Krug received her PhD at Oxford University studying the formation of ordered maps during brain development. Since then she was awarded Royal Society Dorothy Hodgkin and Royal Society University Research Fellowships to conduct her research. Currently, Prof. Krug is an Associate Professor of Neuroscience in the Department of Physiology, Anatomy and Genetics, and Fellow in Biomedical Sciences at Oriel College.
