

Research funding at a glance

ELFI is an electronic research funding information system with an online database for funding opportunities for all fields of scientific research. ELFI offers exhaustive, timely and comprehensive information on research funding programmes, target dates, funding organizations and application periods. A large variety of funding opportunities from a number of countries including the UK are being collected and displayed.

The decline of public funding and ever increasing competitive pressure makes the search for external funding ever more crucial for all research institutions. It is exceedingly time-consuming and work-intensive to filter the vast quantity of information for funding programmes suitable to specific research. The ELFI database offers a prime solution: It deploys the newest autonomous agent technologies to scan websites for relevant information on research funding. With this technology, ELFI keeps track of more than 30,000 internet documents. New programmes as well as changes to existing ones can thus promptly be fed into the database.

An individualised profile technology enables the clear and distinct display of more than 11,000 funding programmes: From the vast number of programmes it filters those that fit the profile of each individual user. As an ELFI customer you secure an enormous advance in knowledge in the competition for ever declining sources of funding.

With our new software the possible applications have been enhanced even further, now also giving you numerous options for

in-house communication. The ability to set different profiles for the various users of your organisation results in a number of exciting possibilities. Access to student scholarships remains free of charge.

ELFI was founded in 1996 (with the help of the DFN Foundation) at the Ruhr University Bochum. After a project stage and an interim period as part of the university business incubator NOVATEC GmbH, ELFI was taken over by its employees and transformed into a private business.

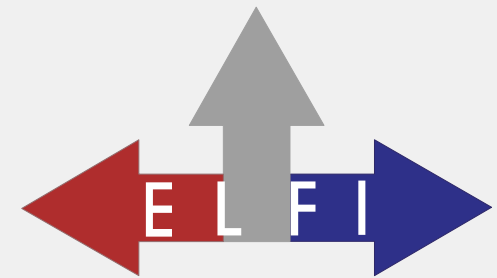
